We'll be looking at our priorities for 2017 this month. We'll be using the information local people have shared with us last year, along with our understanding of significant service transformation plans across Sussex and East Surrey to create more sustainable health and care services.

# **05**Every Voice
Matters

Our recent focus-group attendees gave us valuable feedback so we could support Coastal Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), on the development of communications to all Coastal area patients.

During our Festive Tour local people told us a priority for them is 'better communication with patients'

The letter and accompanying posters/leaflets are to communicate the CCGs plans to improve **GP referrals** and **medicine wastage**. Our work has helped the CCG to better understand consumer needs in language, tone and content.

We speak-up for local people, using what you tell us (without sharing any personal details), to help our Health and Wellbeing Board. They are currently developing the next local **Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment** for publication by 25 February 2018. This assessment will be used by NHS England to determine whether to approve applications to join the local pharmaceutical list under the *National Health Service (Pharmaceutical and Local Pharmaceutical Service Regulations 2013*, as well as any applications to change existing services. It is also used by local commissioners and the local authority when planning and buying services.
